Re:Vitality Update

Thank you to everyone who participated in SGM Workshop Session #1 - 'Overview of Strategic Planning' on Sunday, February 22. We had ~37(!) people in attendance, with some great large-group-discussions about similarities and differences between the Re:Vitality strategic planning approach and that of secular organizations, including some comparison to strategic planning we have done as a congregation in the past. We also discussed why it is so important for congregations to have a single agreed upon approach to developing a Strategic Ministry Plan.

On Sunday, March 29, we will hold SGM Workshop Session #2 - "Building Consensus", as building consensus is an important part of developing the Strategic Ministry Plan, not something to achieve after the plan is put together. Once again we will watch a Video and look at a Case Study, before having a small-group activity with a large-group discussion to follow, and an individual activity with a large-group discussion to follow.

If you were unable to participate in Session #1, Please participate in Session #2 anyway! I can catch-people-up before/after sessions. If you're skeptical, that's okay! We need your input too!! In fact, apprehension in the face of possible changes can actually be a great-blessing, as we will discuss in Session #2.
