

The Seventh Sunday after Pentecost July 27, 2025 Setting Three (LSB p. 184) Luther's commentary on the 7th Commandment shows that he was very concerned about unjust business practices. Stealing is not only physically robbing another's possessions, but it is also taking advantage of other people. Though written almost 500 years ago, Luther's writings still challenge us today and are amazingly relevant & timely, since we live in a culture built on a free-market economy and generally agree that any price charged to people is morally acceptable. Luther points out how working people also steal from their employers by not giving a full day's work for a full day's pay, and toward the end of his discourse on the 7th Commandment, Luther wisely notes that the duty of the Church is to reprove sin and teach the Word of God. It is the duty of governing authorities to restrain lawlessness. The Church, as a spiritual institution, does not order society or enact societal laws; this is solely the duty of the government..

Readings from God's Word

The First Reading is from Second Thessalonians.

But the Lord is faithful. He will establish you and guard you against the evil one. And we have confidence in the Lord about you, that you are doing and will do the things that we command. May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ.

Now we command you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you keep away from any brother who is walking in idleness and not in accord with the tradition that you received from us. For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us, because we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we eat anyone's bread without paying for it, but with toil and labor we worked night and day, that we might not be a burden to any of you.

It was not because we do not have that right, but to give you in ourselves an example to imitate. For even when we were with you, we would give you this command: If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat. For we hear that some among you walk in idleness, not busy at work, but busybodies. Now such persons we command and encourage in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. As for you, brothers, do not grow weary in doing good. If anyone does not obey what we say in this letter, take note of that person, and have nothing to do with him, that he may be ashamed. Do not regard him as an enemy, but warn him as a brother. [2 Thessalonians 3:6-15]


We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.


Lift up your hearts. We lift them unto the Lord.

For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen. [Matt 6:9-13]


The Words of Our Lord
